HISTORIC HOMES TOUR

It's a full immersion into Bastrop History like you've never experienced before! Mark your calendars for Bastrop County Historical Society's Historic Homes Tour, where the Holiday Magic begins: Saturday, December 13, 2025, from Noon to 5 pm. At BCHS our motto is "Bastrop History IS Texas History" and this year's tour truly epitomizes that statement! We have stories of courthouse architects who became world famous, of Texas's first woman professional engineer, of an influential state senator, of a veteran of the last battle of the Civil War, of cattle ranchers and bankers, and of a family of Texas Revolutionary heroes you will not believe once walked the streets of Bastrop. All of this along with the tale of a church celebrating its 190th anniversary and the 100th anniversary of its 1925 structure.

Our 2025 tour includes four historic homes and a church in celebration. Three houses are on the tour for the FIRST TIME EVER this year. Holy cow, it's been 25 YEARS since the fourth has graced the tour. Two homes are listed on the National Register. What a treat!

Help us celebrate a magical holiday season on December 13 -- an afternoon of Bastrop history, architecture, and characters as big as life -- straight out of Texas History!

The Moncure House, constructed in 1910–11 for Bastrop's County Surveyor, this house was the childhood and the retirement home of Texas' first woman professional engineer, Leah Moncure PE # 2250. At the front walk a newly placed Texas historical marker relays her impressive story.

The Paul D. Page House, designed by famed Texas courthouse architects, C. H. Page & Bro., in 1917-18 for Texas State Senator Paul D. Page and his wife, this red brick Prairie/Craftsman displays amazing architectural detailing both inside and out. The architectural firm went on to earn worldwide recognition as Page, Southerland & Page.

The Grimes-Eskew-Hanna Home, built around 1893 by a groceryman, this house was doubled in size by H. J. and Mary Ruth Eskew by 1934. In between (1898–1911) it was home to W. H. Grimes, whose father, brother, uncles and grandfathers were heroes of the Texas Revolution and the Republic. This is the first home, yet, to be attributed to this historic Grimes family in Bastrop.

The Hubbard-Trigg House, first constructed as an 'L' floorplan Folk Victorian in 1890 by a veteran of the last battle of the Civil War, in 1905 the home was morphed by his daughter into this fascinating two-story Greek Revival with Palladian windowed gables and dramatic hallways.

The First United Methodist Church, built in 1925, its congregation celebrates its 190th anniversary and the 100th anniversary of its present structure this year. The first services were held in an unfinished store on Main Street with a Bible and a hymnal placed on a barrel which served as a pulpit.




